Chicago Region Board Meeting Minutes

Porsche Club of America Chicago Region Board Meeting Minutes October 15, 2010

Voting Board Members:

John Ruther, Chuck LaMantia, Brian Beierwaltes, Ed Barnicle, Toby Duckett, Cindy Jacisin, Todd Conforti, Neil MacDonald, and Susan Shire

Coordinators Present: John Diwik, Bob Rath, Pete Hackenson, Peter Faehnrich, Nicki Sangdahl, Chris Ingot, James Jacisin, Carl Walstad, and Steve Rashbaum

Members and Guests Present: Jim, Sharon, and Wesley Ptak, Stanley Sangdahl, Andy Winterbottom, and Pat Yanahan.

Meeting called to order: A quorum being present, John Ruther called the meeting to order at 8:02 p.m., Park Ridge VFW Hall, Park Ridge, IL. John Ruther welcomed the Board members, Club Coordinators, and the attending general members.

Secretary's Report: Secretary Neil MacDonald presented for approval the previously-circulated September 2010 Board minutes. A brief discussion followed, with the Board expressing its approval of the matters described in the minutes. Approved: Unanimously

Treasurer's Report: Treasurer Chuck LaMantia presented the Club's Sept 2010 financial reports. Chuck reported that the Club is revenue positive year to date, but advised that some known event expenses have not yet hit the books. Preliminarily, the Club's track (DE and Club Racing), Concours, and Rallye events are revenue positive on a year-to-date basis, and AX revenue results are consistent with prior-year results. Chuck was continuing to review the financials to make sure that all charitable contributions are properly identified as such. Jim Jacisin, Andy Winterbottom, Pete Hackenson and others discussed a number of matters

related to the Club's revenue generating strength for venue owners, compared to professional and other non-professional event organizers. Motion to approve: Toby Duckett, Second: Todd Conforti Approved: Unanimously

President's Report: John Ruther reported that the Club ballots for the upcoming election of Officers and Directors for the 2011 year had been up-loaded to the website and now were available on the Club's website, and were included in the October Chicago Scene. John indicated that he would be sending periodic email blasts to the membership to get out the vote, and then led the Board's consideration of matters related to selecting Event Coordinators for next year. After discussion, the Board agreed that in light of its overall satisfaction with the operation of this year's events, it would be prudent and efficient to employ an "opt-out" system, under which each of this year's Event Coordinators would serve in that same capacity next year unless he or she affirmatively declined to do so.

~ With only a handful of additional Club events to go before the end of the 2010 season, John offered his thanks to all of those who volunteered this year to make the season a success (and identified for special mention Colleen Beierwaltes and Susan Shire, who volunteered to shop for this year's Dinner Dance raffle prizes). John also thanked those who had sent him suggestions for the Club's annual discretionary awards.

~ Finally, John related that Peggy Gallagher had accepted the Club's invitation to participate in the presentation of the 2010 Enthusiast of the Year Award, to be awarded this year in memory of her late husband and long-time Club member Dan Gallagher.

Vice President's Report: Cindy Jacisin requested that the Event Coordinators forward to her the completed results of this year's competitions so that she could compile the results for the Club's year end awards.

Autocross Report: No report.

Timing & Scoring Report: No report.

Road America Report: No report.

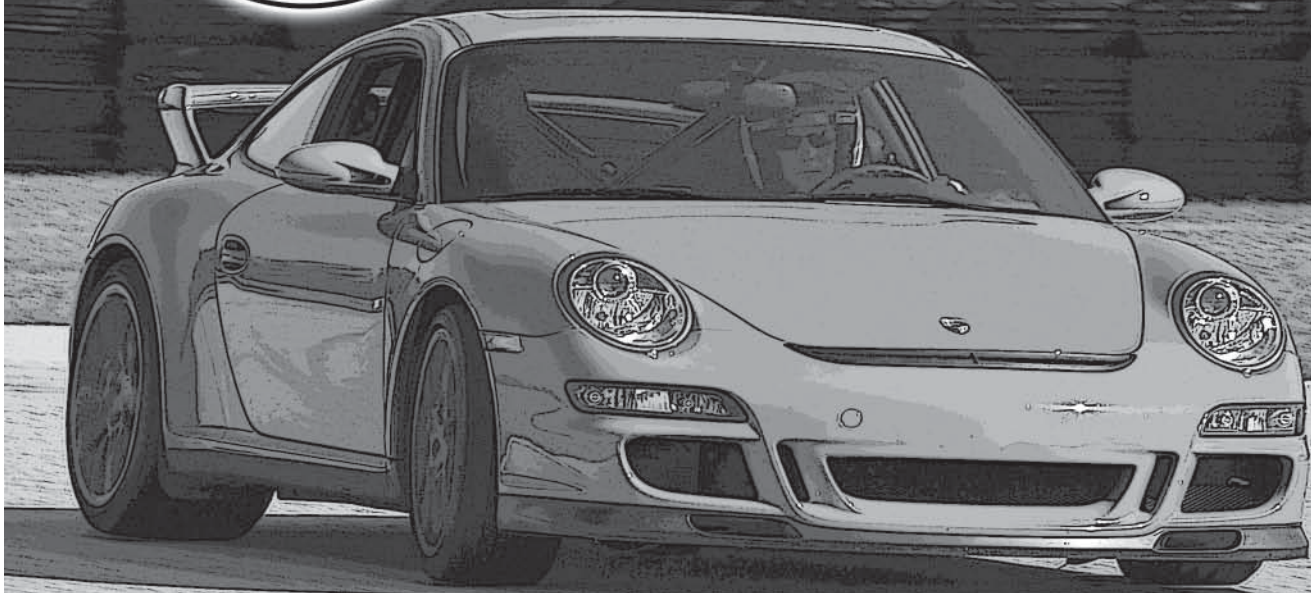

Long before there were posters of “Super Cars” gracing garage, bedroom and basement walls with their drop dead good looks, promises of ultra high performance and questions begging of “how much does a soul go for these days?”, there was the Porsche 904.

Officially named the Porsche Carrera GTS, the 904 arrived just in time for both the 1964 dealer showroom and racing season.

The 904 was originally powered by what was once labeled the most complicated 4 cylinder engine ever made. The 906 version was born when a borrowed 911 six cylinder engine replaced the 4 cam original, and ended when a flat eight was squeezed into the 908 version.

The 904/6/8 series started a series of midengine sportscars that culminated with the all conquering 962, and continues on today with the Porsche Cayman.

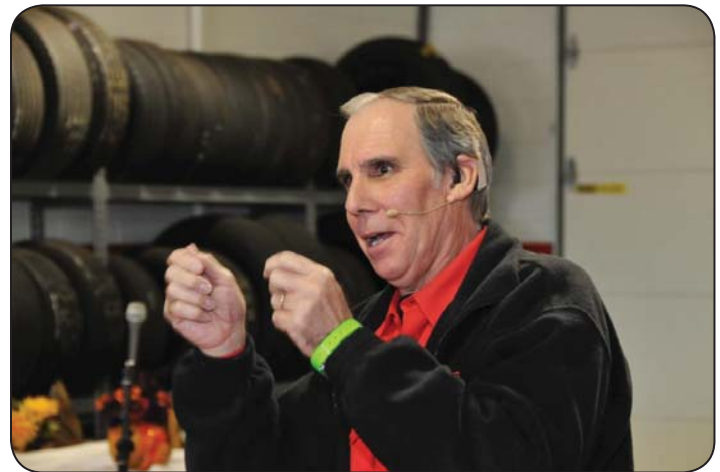
Tech Corner

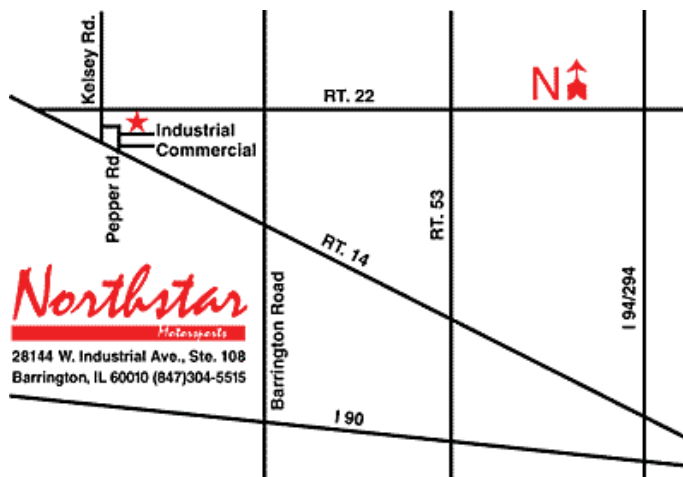


