Here's your opportunity to learn how to drive your Porsche or inferior vehicle at high speed and learn how to do it properly. Change your oil, brake fluid, and brake pads, and come on out and have a great time.

ELKHART I, ROAD AMERICA DRIVERS SCHOOL

Date: May 26 & 27, 1990

Place: Road America, Elkhart Lake, Wisconsin

Two days of Road America Drivers School. Drive Road America like you've never driven it before. Run groups will alternate half hour sessions of open track lapping. You will have plenty of track time to practice those turns, learn that line, and discover those nuances while running continuous laps.

Saturday, novices will go through a half day Skip Barber drivers school to learn the proper technique for braking, cornering, and above all, safe negotiation of the track and common sense safety practices. New comers will then get their chance to lap the track while being observed and critiqued by Skip Barber instructors. Then, new comers will join the alternating run groups for a day and a half of lapping. What better way to learn the track and have lots of fun.

All corners will be staffed by professional SCCA corner workers. Passing will be restricted to certain straightaways, under specific rules; no passing will be allowed in braking or turn areas. Specific following distances will be strictly enforced. It is your responsibility to thoroughly check your car yourself, or have it checked by a competent service organization prior to this event. Use the Chicago region tech sheet. Be sure to flush your brake fluid no more than 90 days in advance of this event, or after any high speed event run prior to this event. Brake pads - show up with plenty of pad thickness; high performance after market pads are better suited to track events, and still work well on the street. Mandatory clothing is a 1980 or later Snell approved helmet (this is a change from last year's 1975 requirement, so please check your helmet to be sure you are in compliance), long sleeve shirt, long pants, and socks, all made of non-synthetic material, and shoes with leather uppers (no open toed shoes or sandals). Recommended, but not mandatory, are drivers suits and driving gloves made of nonflammable material, fire extinguishers, and a safety harness. Of the recommended items, the safety harness is most highly recommended. Due to a local ordinance, all cars must run with mufflers.

SPECIAL!! Twice each day there will be an opportunity to run Touring laps with your family or other passengers (if desired), no helmets required. Speed will be limited to 75 MPH, no passing allowed, any make of car acceptable. So, all you folks out there who have never been on a track before, or those who would like some low speed practice, come on out and see what it's all about. We guarantee you'll have lots of fun!

Mandatory drivers meeting for novices will be at Siebkens, 8:00pm. Friday evening, where you will receive instruction as well as pertinent information as to the format and rules of the event. Saturday and Sunday mornings, there will be a brief mandatory drivers meeting for all drivers at 8:00am. Anyone missing the mandatory drivers meetings will not drive.

Registration opens at Siebkens on Friday afternoon at 4:00 pm. The tech crew led by Glen Sapa will be on hand to scrutinize your car. If you plan to arrive early Friday afternoon, please join us at the track where we will be setting up the course.

Registration is limited to 100 cars. We expect a sell out; advertising will be in the April and May issues of PANO, so register early. You will be notified of your acceptance by mail. Although official registration is still required, first timers will receive their event packets by mail to allow plenty of time to study the material. Please be prepared to present your valid drivers license at registration time.

John Laidlaw is the event chairman; Glen Sapa and Jim Becker are the Tech and Safety Chairmen responsible for monitoring all safety aspects of this event.

We are looking forward to a fun and safe two days. See you there.

A CONCOURS PRIMER

By Dale Block

Given the large influx of new members who may not know what a concours is, or what/how to prepare for one, I felt that it may be a good time for a "primer" on concours competition, Chicago-Region style.

Our region features four classes of competition. In ascending order of detail/complexity/things to clean, they are:

Class D - Bodywork topside, interior

Class C - Bodywork topside, interior, trunk(s)

Class B - Bodywork topside, interior, trunk(s), engine compartment

Class A - Everything!

The class schedule indicates a "natural" (if cleaning your car with Q-tips can be considered natural) progression of competition. As you and your car progress, there are corresponding higher levels of competition available.

To equalize new and old cars, bonus points are awarded according to schedule for age and mileage. For further details, refer to your membership directory in the concours section.

How to...

One of the most basic questions asked is what exactly is required for a concours? How and when you begin your preparations depends on how serious you are towards the competition, and to a much larger extent, if your car is in daily use and your class selection. Remember that you can always move up in class during a year and still receive points, but you cannot drop down (e.g., D to C is OK but A to B would not).

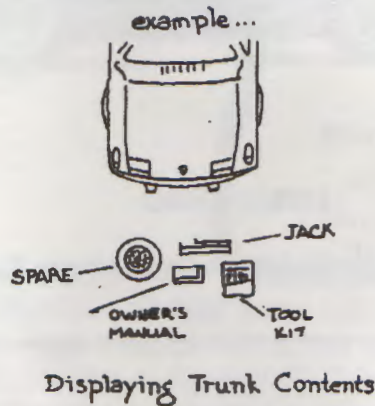
I typically start during the week of the concours and clean one area at a time (bodywork, then interior, then trunk, etc.) per night. This way the "task" doesn't seem so bad. By the end of the week the car should be ready, with only minor detailing left for the site. There are those who will completely wash and wax at the site - whatever works for you. I try to have the minimum work left (windows, "dusting", etc) at the site so that I can enjoy the event and the camaraderie (a.k.a. kibbitzing, bench-racing, B.S.).

A note on Armor-All and the like - keep their use to a minimum; cut them with water; wipe them off to eliminate the "greasy" feel. Don't forget that these products are veritable dust-magnets, so apply them at the site.

When displaying your car, be sure to remove all loose items from the glove box, under the seats, etc. Presentation of the trunk kit should be done at the front of the car (see drawing). If your car has a removable roof, it should be installed/up.

Last, don't be intimidated to ask questions! We all had first events and made some semi-serious gaffes, so why not give concours a try? You already keep your Porsche in a better state than the "typical" car - it is just an incremental step up to "concours prep". Don't forget the signs of spring include Q-tips, chamois and P-21s!

To steal a quote from a predecessor, clean cars finish first. See you at Barrington.

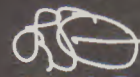

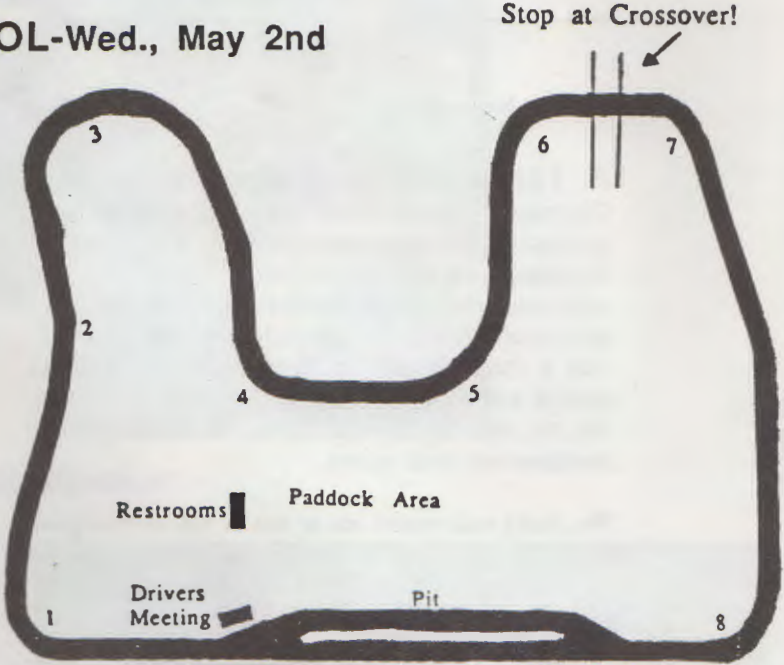

A TECHNICAL VIEWPOINT

911 Speedometer Adjustment

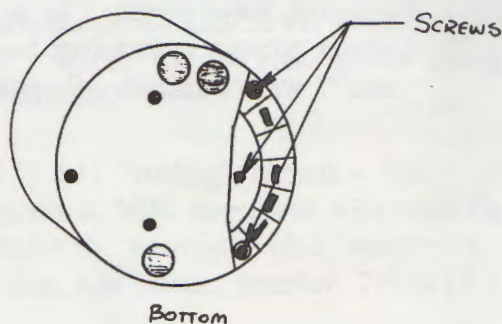
Did you ever get a ticket for going over the speed limit and swear you were only going 60 mph? Or notice that everyone drives really slow? Maybe they don't own a Porsche. Your speedometer may not be adjusted correctly for the tires that are on your car. I noticed about a 7 mph change between my original Goodyear NCT's and Yokohama AVS's. Here I will explain how to adjust your speedometer.

First you should have your speedometer checked by asking a Police officer to clock your car with a radar gun. Most will have no problem helping or will ask you to schedule time with another officer. This IS the most accurate way to find out how much your car is off. Most chances are that the car will be off by no more than +/- 3 mph. If off by that amount just remember what your car is off by and drive by it. Remember as your tires wear, the speed displayed will be faster than your actual speed. Also tire pressure will affect the displayed speed. If it's off a great deal or 3 mph bothers you, get a friend with a digital dash to help out. Get his car clocked and use it as a pace car to adjust your speedo.

This project is an easy one, but if you are not careful, you can break the speedo. The pot on the interior that we need to adjust is not easy to get to or adjust so be VERY careful. No sob stories please!

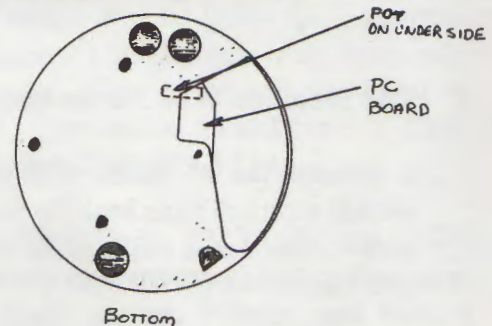
If you are still game, let's start.

1. Pull out the speedometer by pulling with your fingers in a rocking motion.
2. As all good mechanics do, write down where each wire connects.
3. Now remove the the 3 screws holding down the plastic connector block as shown in (Fig. 1).



4. Pull back the connector block gently to expose the interior electronics.

5. Find the adjustment pot as shown in (Fig. 2).



6. Reconnect the speedo to your cars electrical system and push it in the hole partially.
7. Recheck your tire pressure.
8. Go find your buddy with the pace car.
9. Now drive around to see how much the speedo is in error.
10. Pull over and adjust the pot.
11. Repeat steps 8 & 9 until it is exact.
12. Reassemble and reinstall.
13. Find officer friendly and get your car clocked again.

Now doesn't that feel good knowing you can speed EXACTLY 55 mph.... oops I mean 5 mph over the limit.

Tech Tip of the Month

Write the oil type and date changed on the oil filter with permanent marker. This way you can't lose the information. Of course, this works really well on 911's. Another reason to own a real Porsche. (My view point.)

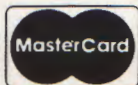
