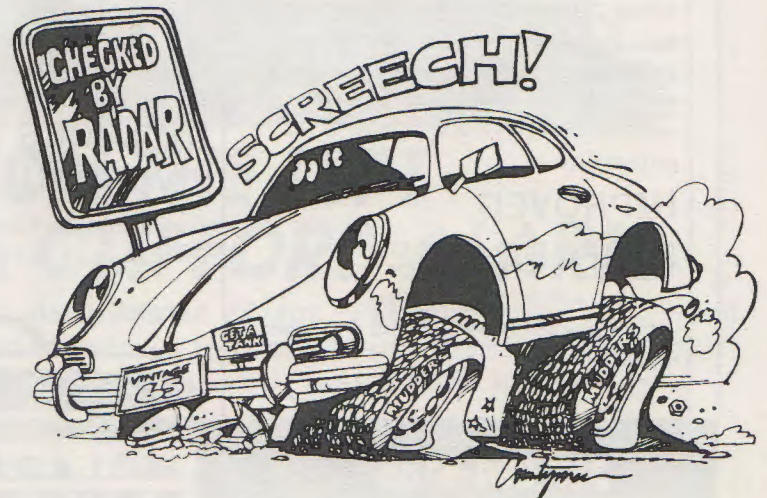
arguing or bickering over the instructions. We were having fun.

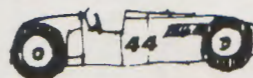
SECOND ANNUAL BARRINGTON CONCOURS

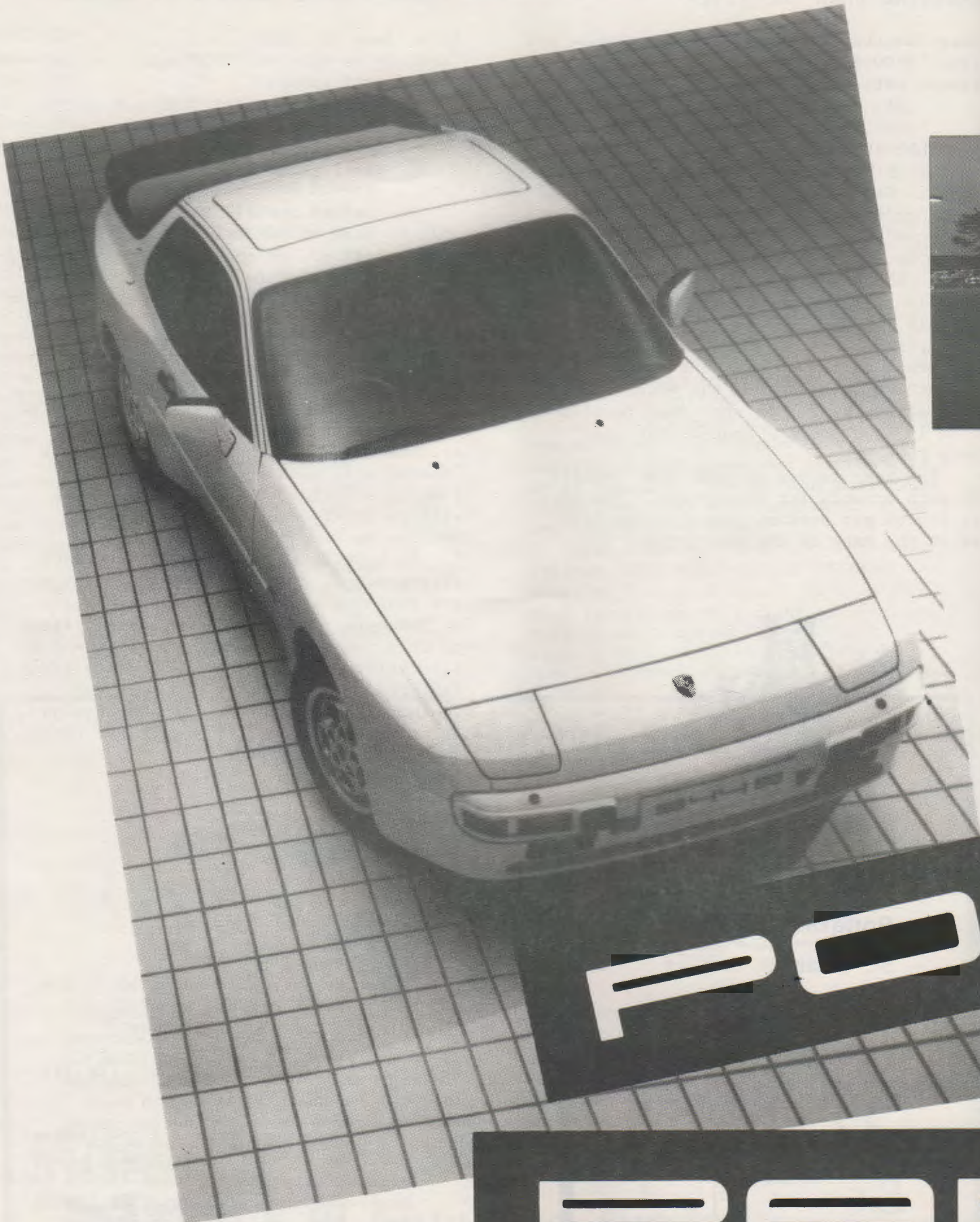

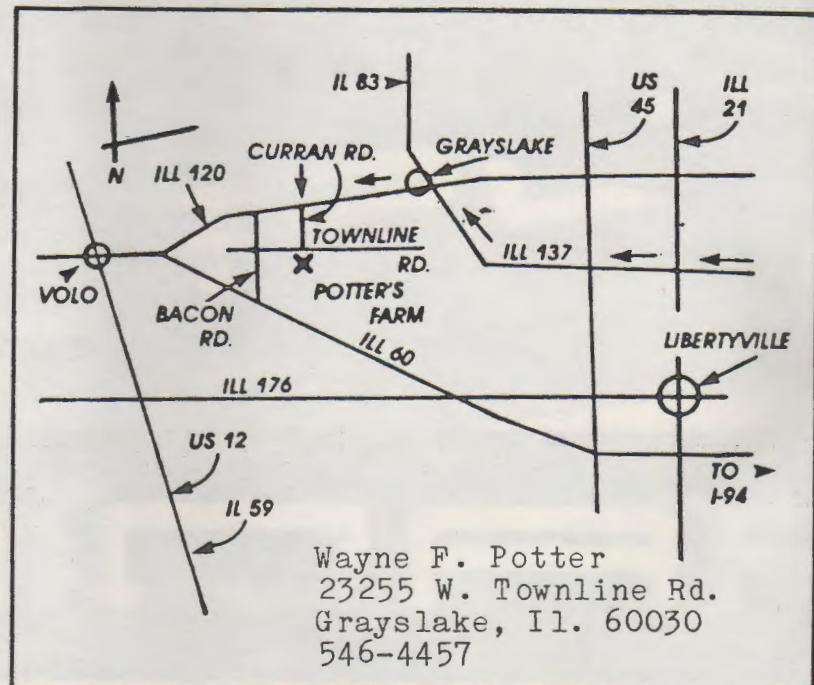
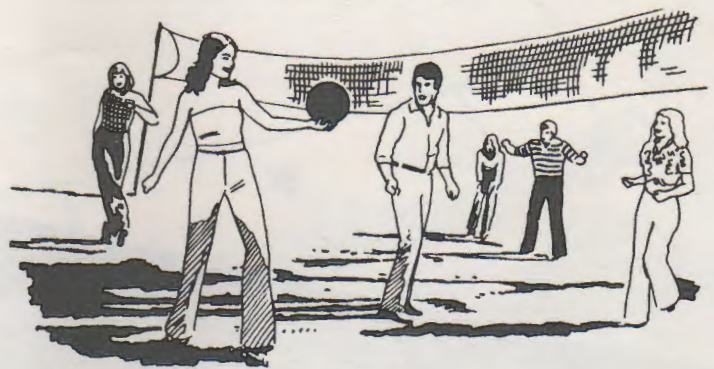

So, clean up the Porsche, gather up the family, and come out for a day of good food, great friends, beautiful cars, and lots of fun.



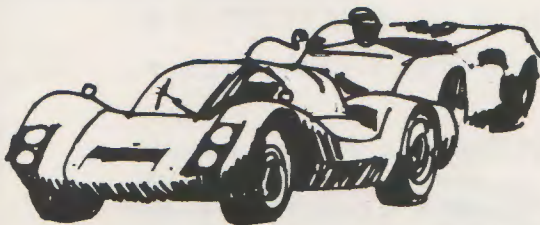

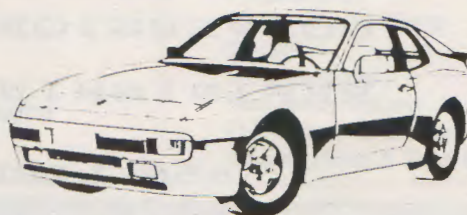

join us. You won't regret it. Why, you might even be lucky enough to be among the chosen few who get to write an article for me. Many are called, but few are chosen.

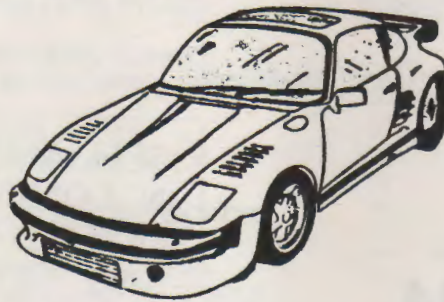
