Life in the Fast Lane

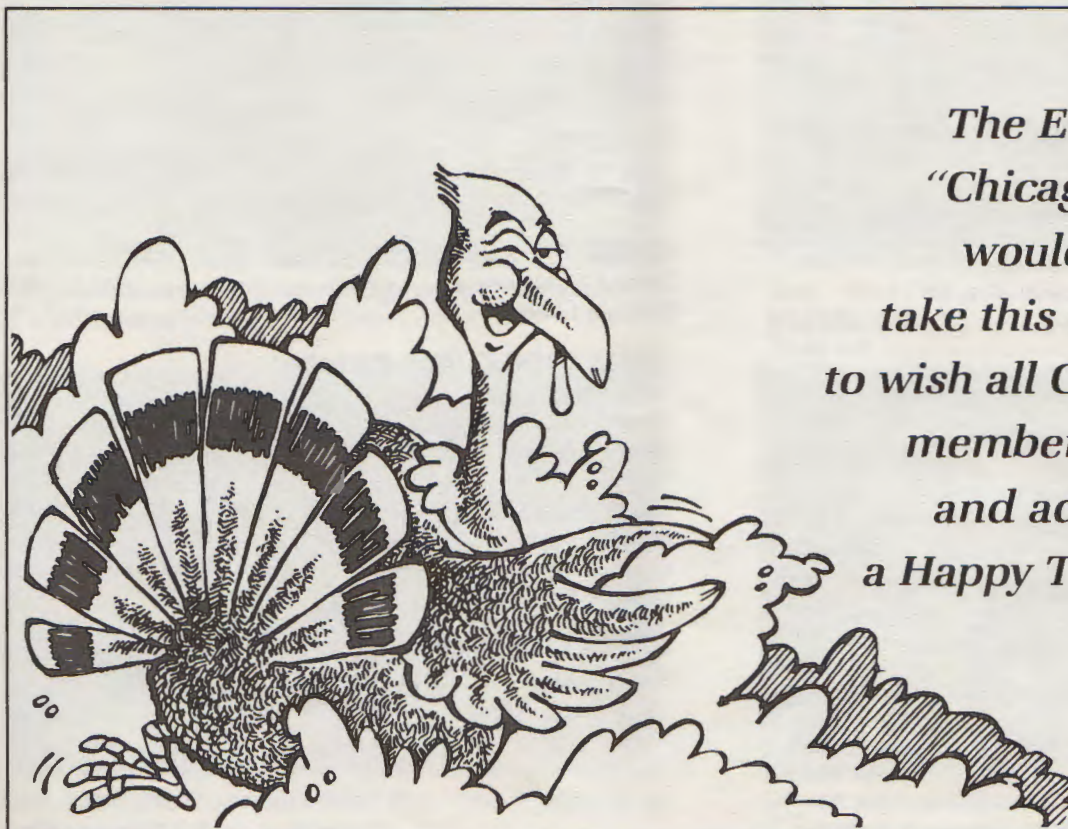

The U.S. Department of Transportation says motorists are ignoring the 55 mph speed limit. Surveys they have conducted show that motorists, by a 42 percent average, drove faster than 55 mph in 1984. On rural interstates, 3 out of every 4 speed. Data from 1985 surveys indicate that percentages will continue upward.

West Virginia is the most law-abiding with 25.5 percent of drivers exceeding 55. Maryland, Vermont and Arizona averages above 50 percent and face loss of up to \$12 million in federal highway aid unless they can get drivers to slow down. As a consequence, Vermont is using air patrols, Arizona will boost patrols, and Maryland will use more "rolling roadblocks"—patrol officers driving three abreast at 55 to slow cars behind them.

For Washington state, the average mph is 56.1, with 39.6 percent of drivers exceeding 55 mph for 1984. Speeding citations issued for the state were 123,540. Comparatively, Oregon had 45.6 percent of its drivers exceeding the limit, with 102,940 citations issued. California had 45.4% of drivers exceeding 55 mph and 1,068,431 speeding tickets issued, both considerably higher than this state.

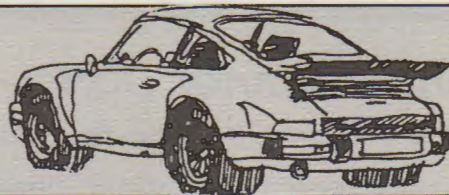
Nationally, the Department of Transportation says that 42 percent of total drivers exceeded the limit, and that 8,026,920 speeding tickets were issued last year. ■

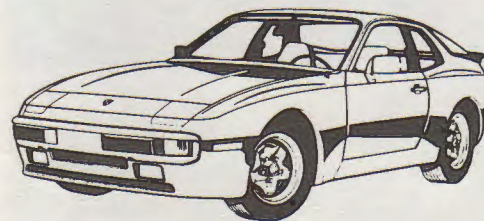
