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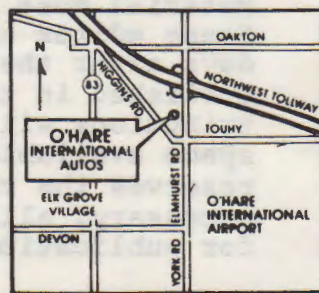
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POTTER'S PICNIC 1981

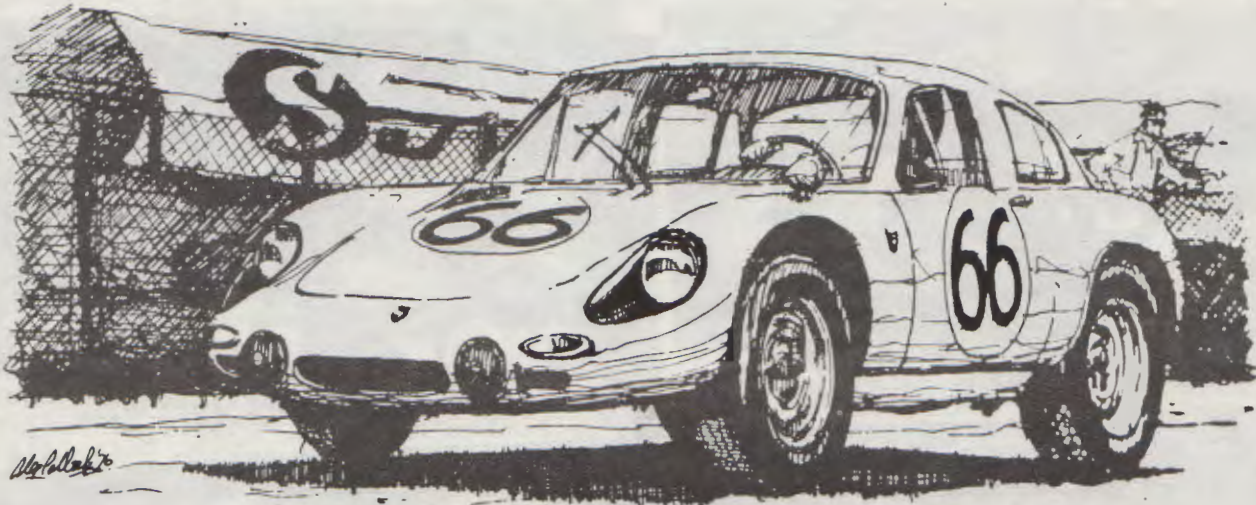
Linda Gutmann: "In Northern Illinois the probability of a rain shower lasting all day is extremely remote. I predict this little cloud will pass in just a few minutes."

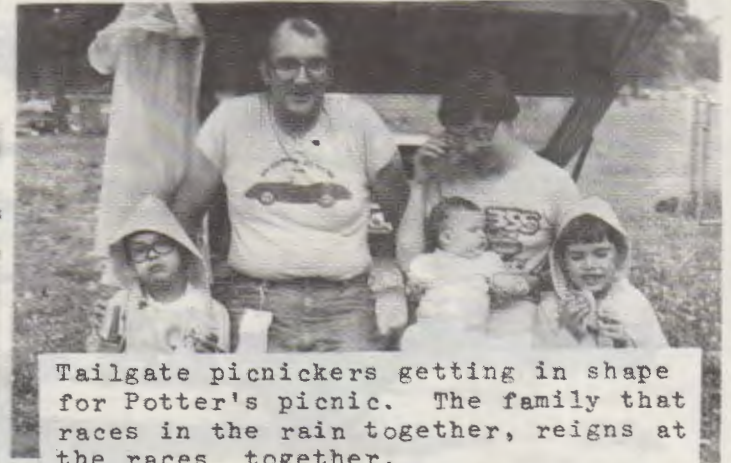
