Following the tour we will proceed to the White Fence Farm for cocktails and dinner, your choice from the menu. The Farm is on 66-A, 7 miles north of Stateville.

Please read the following carefully:

Stateville is located 5 miles north of Joliet on Alternate 66. Take the Tri-State south to Interstate 55; Interstate 55 to the intersection of Alternate 66, which is at the Welco Truck Stop and approximately 8 miles from Stateville. Take 66-A south, past Lewis College and Illinois State Police District 5 to the front entrance. The Penitentiary is 1 mile in off 66-A. There will be ample parking. Be sure to lock your cars, both ignition system and doors, and retain your key.

Before leaving the car, leave all medications, nail files, pocket knives, pipe cleaners in your car, as a security check will require these items to be deposited with the front gate guard until after the tour if you have not left them in the car.

The tour will last 1-1/2 to 2 hours.
